It is vital that we, as alumni, contribute time, energy, and our financial resources to our Fraternity. Our gifts are an investment in the lives of our active members and the future of Pi Chapter. We thank all the alumni who've already contributed, as those gifts have directly impacted our undergraduate members.

We are at a critical point in our capital campaign. At the end of this year, we will evaluate what projects can be completed during the summer of 2011. This will constitute phase one of our renovations, and we'd like to complete as much as possible while the students are on summer vacation.

We need to know what kind of dollars we've got to work with, and this is where you come in. We need to get closer to our goal of \$1.5 million, and we can only do this with your support.

There are several major projects, such as total insulation of the building's shell replacing over 75 windows with new insulated windows, and significant parts of the mechanical and electrical projects, that we may not be able to complete with the dollars we've raised as of today. However, your pledge can make the difference.

In addition to the projects mentioned above, here are some other projects we would like to do next summer:

- Begin room renovations to allow beds in semi-private, versatile living spaces
- Start the phased updating of the mechanical, electrical, plumbing, and life safety systems
- Create four to five different room type scenarios providing a range of offerings to appeal to various student needs and desires
- Upgrade the Fraters kitchen in the back dining room to become an Internet café while still serving breakfast and weekend meals
- Add ADA-accessible, two-bed apartment
- Begin basement renovations of the social spaces, install basement toilet rooms, new exits, ventilation, and enlargement connecting hallways

We must focus our efforts and ensure the same opportunities provided to us will be available for our future members. To remain a strong fraternity on campus, we must provide a competitive facility that accommodates growth and attracts the best and brightest young men.

Several fraternities on campus have undergone major renovation projects. For example, Phi Kappa Psi and Sigma Chi renovated their houses in 2008, and Alpha Gamma Rho renovated theirs this summer. Sigma Chi reported 40% total alumni participation during their campaign while ours is currently 26%. Let's make our campaign the best by having more participation than any other fraternity on campus.

Frederick Villforth '68 still feels the sense of pride for Teke that he did 42 years ago. Perhaps it is Pi Chapter's high level of standards that sets the group apart from the rest. "It [belonging to the Fraternity] included things like civility, manners, meeting standards (hard to believe now, but we were not to wear blue jeans on campus), and respect for others."

He donated to the campaign for Pi Chapter so other young men can experience the advantages of Teke in a modern and safe home. "TKE offered a home-like atmosphere, with opportunities to meet men involved in many on-campus activities. The food was good, the atmosphere was upbeat, men were creative, and expectations were high."

Already a contributor, Fred hopes fellow Fraters consider supporting the campaign since they are now in a better position to give financially than

they were as recent graduates. He says alumni can make a difference in the lives of young men. "The current Fraters have each given to the campaign, and they are still students. Now, we must do our part."

Retired from Texaco/Caltex/Chevron, Fred was initially involved in fuel and lubricant research. He later worked for Saudi Aramco, then in fuel technical service for Caltex in Asia. Among other things, the bylaws establish policies on such matters as behavior, keeping the house clean, financial responsibility for property damage and repairs, parking, and housing of guests. They also specify responsibilities for Chapter officers and committee chairmen and establish detailed election policies.
